Dear Mom, Dad & Everyone:-

How is everyone at home?

Still O.K. I hope. All well and happy. I'm still alright but I'm having a time learning everything but I will get on the ball in a few weeks I hope. At this date I haven't received any mail from anyone but as far away as I am I don't expect any before the 18 or 19 April. I'm writing this to pass some information along to you you should know. If anything should happen at home such as serious

illness etc and you want me to come home at once do this. (1) Send me a telegram yourself. (2) At the same time have the Red Cross Chapter at Elkhorn send a telegram to the Red Cross at Camp Adair. If you do this I can leave within a few hours after I get the telegram. If the Red Cross there doesn't send a telegram the Red Cross here will have to verify my telegram which would delay my leaving 24 hours or more. So keep this in mind if occasion comes to send for me which
