France.  
20 JAN. 1945

Here I am somewhere in France just as I always figured I never would go. And if this is a fair sample of the Country it looks pretty good to me. The weather is cold but to-day is miserable on account of the rain. Mud, Mud everywhere. I'm still in good health at this writing. I only hope I don't catch cold. Now that I'm here life is reduced to the bare essentials. Keeping warm and dry are my main daily occupations. And getting enough to eat!! I'm not in any danger of starving but more would be welcome. So if you can please send me a box of good old Toll House Cookies. I didn't have very much money when I arrived here - only \$1.26. When that was exchanged for French currency I received 62 Francs. 1 Franc equals 2¢. That will do me til pay day. May get a change of surroundings soon. Never call till in a combat zone. Lots of love to each and all. Kiss and hug Ronald & Teddy for me. Will write again in a couple days. Yours son,
