France.
26 JAN - 1945

I still haven't heard from you but guess it's on account of you sending me 3 E letters. U-Mail or airmail are much quicker. Hope everyone at home are feeling fine. I'm still in good health. Rather cold in this cut loose life tho. My fingers are pretty cold and stiff while writing this - I don't know whether you can read it or not. I've been having a time trying to talk to the French people I meet personally. I'm not doing so good but guess I'll catch on more the longer I stay here. We are living in the field and at times I wish you could see me slogging around in the mud. And a real, both would be heavenly right now. It has been so cold that washing your hands and face and shaving gets to be a ambitious job. Wood really is a scarce com here. I've been to towns and around the County-side and see never seen a wooden building yet. They use cement, field stones and brick. And no fence either - stone walls every direction you look. Will write you a longer letter soon. I have time and will send you some French money. All my love to all and esp. your son,
