I --- AWARD OF THE FIRST OAK LEAF CLUSTER TO THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL:

By direction of the President, under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the First Oak Leaf Cluster to the Bronze Star Medal is awarded the following individuals for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy:

CHARLES A. GALLOWAY, O 329 969, Lieutenant Colonel, Infantry First Battalion, 276th Infantry, on 8 January to 22 March 1945, France. Entered military service from Nebraska City, Nebraska.

JOHN J. MORGAN, O 408 801, Captain, Infantry, Company D, 274th Infantry, near Philippsbourg, France, from 4 to 21 January 1945. Entered military service from Miami, Florida.

II --- AWARD OF THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL. By direction of the President, under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended the Bronze Star Medal is awarded the following individuals for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy:

HUGH E. ANDREWS, O1 001 288, Captain, Adjutant General's Department, Headquarters 70th Infantry Division, from 6 February to 8 May 1945, in France and Germany. Entered military service from Westbrook, Maine.

ROBERT E. ARN, O23 470, Major, Field Artillery, 883d Field Artillery Battalion, from 7 February to 21 March 1945, in Alsace France. Entered military Service from Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

ERNEST T. BECKLEY, O 353 116, Captain, Field Artillery, Headquarters 882nd Field Artillery Battalion, from 7 February to 19 March 1945. Entered military service from California.

EDWARD C. BRETT, O 337 935, Captain, Adjutant General's Department, from 6 February to 14 March 1945 and from 23 April to 8 May 1945, in France and Germany. Entered military service from Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

COMER CLAY, O1 177 333, First Lieutenant, Field Artillery Headquarters 882d Field Artillery Battalion, from 7 February to 19 March 1945, in France and Germany. Entered military service from Ranger, Texas.
