I ---- AWARD OF THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL. By direction of the President, under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following individuals for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy on dates indicated:

NORMAN A ANDERSON, O 305 686, Lieutenant Colonel, Field Artillery, 725th Field Artillery Battalion, from 18 January to 21 March 1945, in France and Germany. Entered military service from Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

LLOYD J BOSS, 37 572 068, Staff Sergeant, Headquarters Battery, 883d Field Artillery Battalion, from 6 February to 24 March 1945, in France and Germany. Entered military service from Wabasha, Minnesota.

JOHN J DRENNAN, O1 168 645, Captain, Field Artillery, Headquarters Battery, 70th Division Artillery, from 14 February to 21 March 1945, in Alsace, France. Entered military service from Carbondale, Pennsylvania.

AUGUST V GROSSKOPF, O1 592 878, 1st Lieutenant, Quartermaster Corps, MIS ETOUSA, from 7 January to 2 April 1945, in France and Germany. Entered military service from Great Neck, Long Island, New York.

BURTON H HOLMES, O1 165 743, Captain, Field Artillery, 70th Division Artillery, from 14 February to 21 March 1945, in Alsace, France. Entered military service from Lima, Ohio.

HOWARD J JOHN, O15 802, Colonel, Field Artillery, 70th Division Artillery, from 14 February to 21 March 1945, in Alsace, France. Entered United States Military Academy from Fulton, Missouri.

PAUL E KOEFOD, O1 031 734, 1st Lieutenant, Cavalry, 70th Reconnaissance Troop, from 8 February to 8 May 1945, in France and Germany. Entered military service from Bemidji, Minnesota.

JOHN F LARRICK, O 389 309, Major, Field Artillery, Headquarters, 70th Division Artillery, from 14 February to 21 March 1945, in Alsace, France. Entered military service from Middletown, Virginia.

THOMAS J LEONARD, 37 072 217, Staff Sergeant, 570th Signal Company, from 6 February to 25 February 1945, in St Jean Rohrbach, France. Entered military service from Ponca, Nebraska.

ANTHONY J MACIULEWICZ, 36 762 969, Technician Fifth Grade, Headquarters Company, 70th Infantry Division, from 26 December 1944 to 2 February 1945, in France and Germany. Entered military service from Chicago, Illinois.

CHARLES A PENNINGTON, 20 823 601, Sergeant, 570th Signal Company, from 11 February to 6 March 1945, near Farschwiller, France. Entered military service from Arkansas City, Kansas.

ORVILLE E QUINN, 37 250 298, Master Sergeant, Headquarters 70th Infantry Division, from 26 December 1944 to 3 February 1945, in France. Entered military service from Doland, South Dakota.

MILTON E ROSS, O 287 541, Lieutenant Colonel, Field Artillery, 70th Division Artillery, from 14 February to 21 March 1945, in Alsace, France. Entered military service from Westchester, Iowa.
